This declaration must be completed and signed by the spouse or common-law partner in Canada of a victim of flight ET302 or PS752 who wish to have their **extended family member(s)** join them in Canada. If the victim does not have a surviving spouse or common-law partner, or if the partner is not in Canada, this declaration may be completed and signed by the child (18 years of age or older) of a victim or guardian of the child (under 18). The in-Canada surviving spouse/child or guardian of the child must complete and sign this form by solemn declaration in the presence of a person who, by law, is authorized to receive a solemn declaration.

The in-Canada surviving family member in Canada may sign a statutory declaration for up to two principal applicants.

NOTE: The final decision on admission to Canada is made by the Canada Border Services Agency upon arrival and the foreign national must continue to meet all the usual eligibility and admissibility requirements in the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA).
