



STATUTORY DECLARATION ATTESTING TO THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE CANADIAN CITIZEN OR PERMANENT RESIDENT AND UKRANIAN FOREIGN NATIONAL

Canadian citizen or permanent resident, 18 years or older, residing in Canada must complete and sign this form by a solemn declaration in the presence of a person who, by law, is authorized to receive a solemn declaration. By signing this form, Canadian citizen or permanent resident attests to their relationship to their spouse or common-law partner, child (regardless of age), grandchild, parent, grandparent or sibling. Canadian citizen or permanent resident must also complete this declaration if their child (18 years or older), grandchild (18 years or older), parent, grandparent or sibling is unable to leave Ukraine, is missing, presumed dead or deceased, and their spouse or common-law partner in Canada is applying to remain in Canada permanently.
