



## STATUTORY DECLARATION TO CONFIRM THE RELATIONSHIP TO EXTENDED FAMILY MEMBER AND RESIDENCY IN CANADA

This declaration must be completed and signed by the previously resettled Yazidi or survivor of Daesh in Canada who wishes to have their **extended family member** join them in Canada. The previously resettled Yazidi or survivor of Daesh in Canada must complete and sign this form by solemn declaration in the presence of a person who, by law, is authorized to receive a solemn declaration. The previously resettled Yazidi or survivor of Daesh in Canada must send a copy of this form to their **extended family member in Iraq** to be included in their application package.
